

We invite you to support local teachers in their efforts to create welcoming and productive learning environments for their students as a sponsor of the Mass Teacher Resources (MTR) Free Store, opening in September 2024.

Many schools send home a list of items that parents can purchase for their children's classroom. In Massachusetts, a standard supply list for an elementary (K-5) school requires parents to purchase 8-10 items at a cost of up to \$75 per student, an expense which is out of reach for many low income families. To fill the gap, teachers often purchase these items themselves. Although teachers are paid far less than those in other professions, more than 90% of teachers typically spend an average of \$750 to \$1,000 per year out of their own pocket to provide their students with the basic tools they need to learn.

Educators do this because they want their students to learn and feel comfortable in their classrooms. But for many educators, that annual spending takes a toll.

At Mass Teacher Resources, we believe that teachers should not have to use their own money to support their students. MTR was formed to address this real need. We are the only organization in the state that exists solely to offer these items to qualified teachers at no cost.

The MTR Free Store is a place for qualified teachers to get the classroom supplies they need completely free of charge.

The MTR Free Store serves full-time classroom teachers at Title 1 public elementary schools in Greater Boston, located within Routes 495/95; this area encompasses 70 communities and 272 Title 1 elementary schools. Schools are designated as Title 1 if at least 40% of the student population is low-income. Teachers at these schools often face a demanding work environment, fueled by limited resources, low parental involvement and students with high needs.

Sponsor support will ensure the successful launch of the MTR Free Store and our ambitious goal to serve 1,000 teachers this school year. Financial contributions are needed to help cover the start-up and operational costs of setting up the retail space, including rack systems, shelving, bins, and carts, as well as the ongoing expense of rent and utilities.

When students have the right tools for learning, their participation improves, their confidence increases, and their self-esteem grows. Mass Teacher Resources is committed to supporting local teachers in their important work to create classrooms that are welcoming and equitable, to inspire excitement and a love of learning for their students.
