Our goal is to help relieve the financial burden many teachers take on to ensure that their students have the tools they need to learn. We are seeking enthusiastic, people-oriented individuals who are passionate about the mission of MTR, and are able to "roll up their sleeves" and activity contribute to efforts to launch and scale this important new organization. Ideal Advisory Board members also possess:

- Willingness to work collaboratively with multiple constituencies: staff, other volunteers, board directors, donors, sponsors, and other stakeholders
- Excellent people skills, with a genuine desire to be helpful
- An ability to have fun while working hard
